1. Introduction

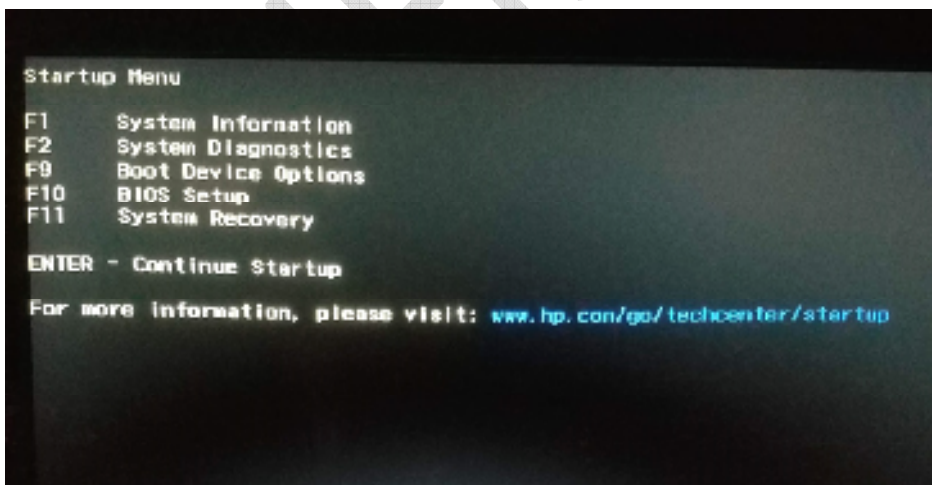
This document will describe how to recover the boot configuration for the Sim-mgr laptops. When the Sim-mgr laptops are initially configured, they are set up to boot automatically into the Ubuntu operating system and to load a browser showing the vital signs monitor.

If the laptops fail to boot into the Ubuntu operating system, the following steps will show how to recover the correct boot sequence.

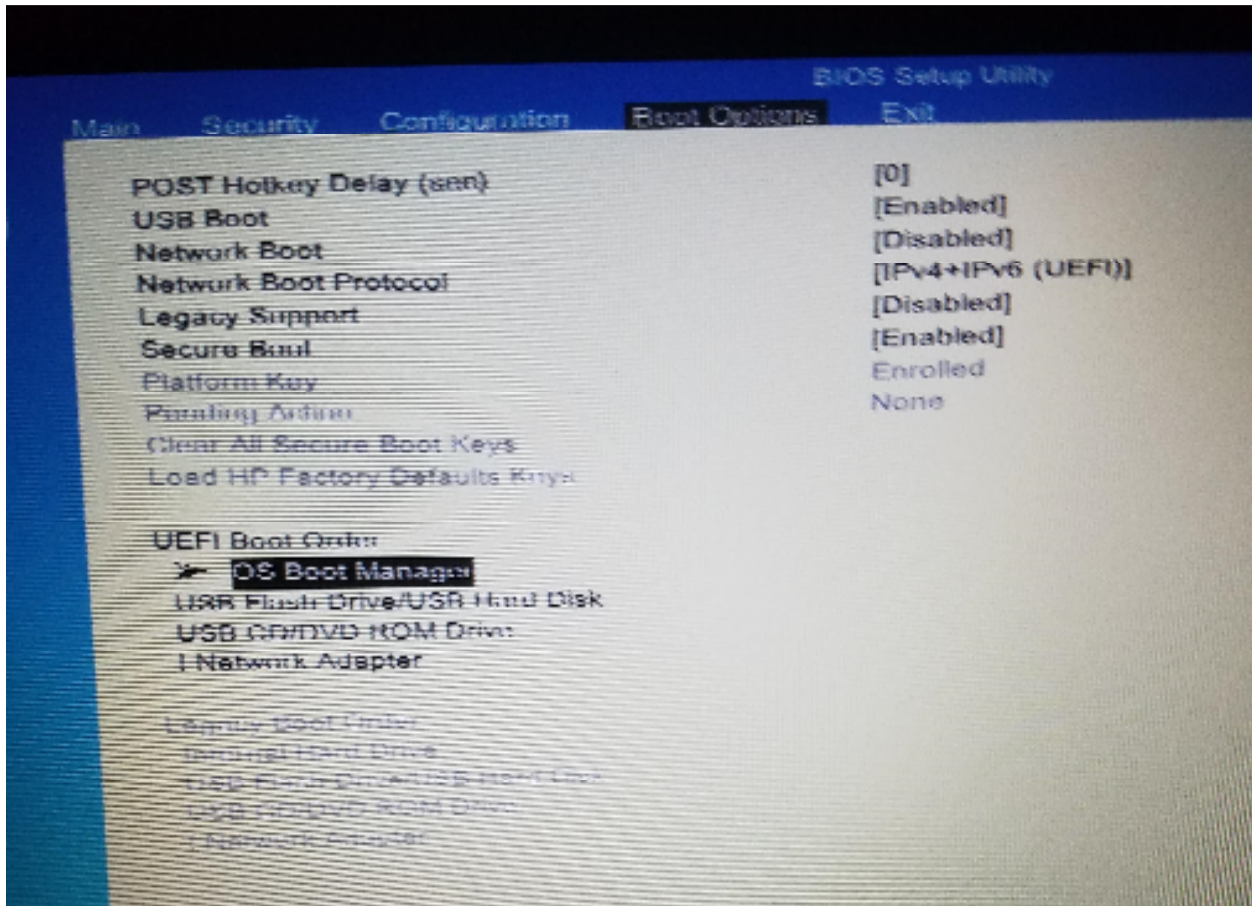
It is assumed that the sim-mgr laptop is an HP. The following sequence may need to be modified for other laptop brands.

2. Boot Configuration Setup

1. Power up the sim-mgr laptop from a complete power down.
2. Immediately after pressing the power key, begin pressing the 'esc' key repeatedly.
3. Continue until the Startup Menu appears.

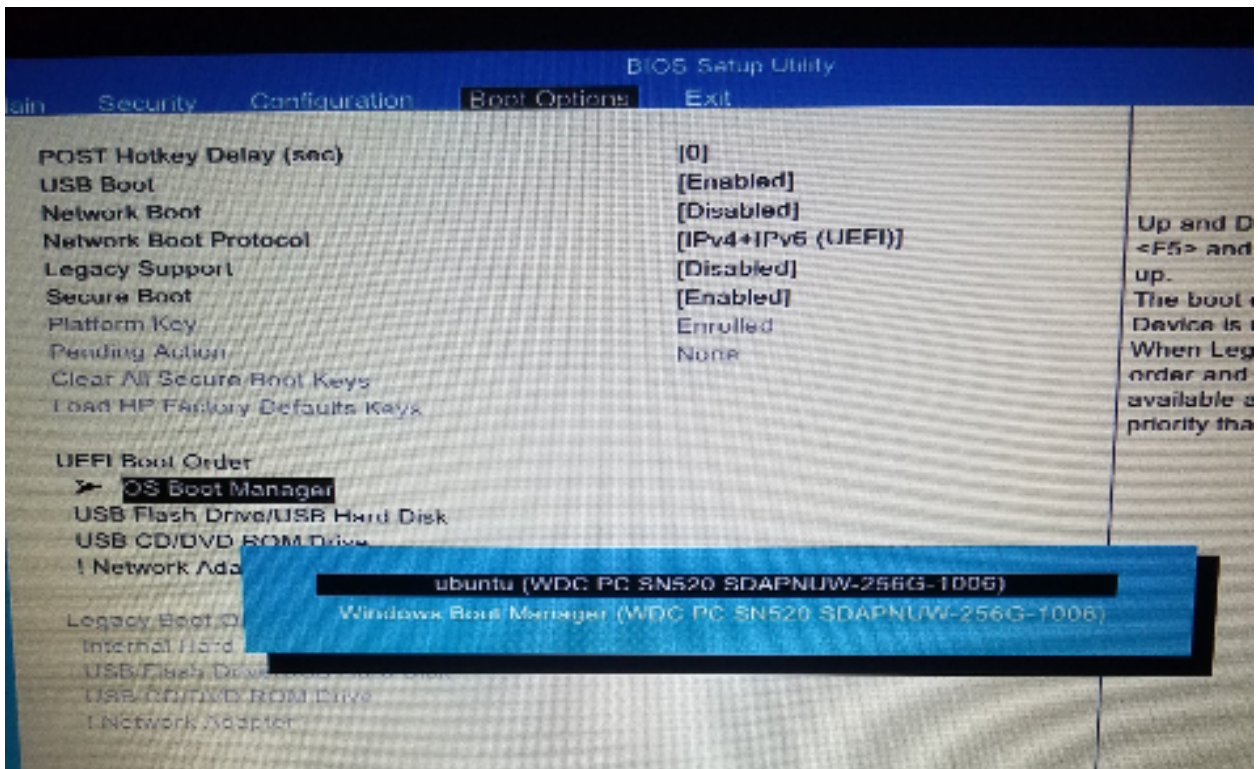


4. Press the F10 Key “BIOS Setup”.



5. Use the right cursor key to select the “Boot Options” menu. Use the down arrow key to select the “OS Boot Manager”.

- Use the up or down arrows to select the “Ubuntu...” boot option. The press either the F5 or F6 key to make that choice the default choice.



- Press the F10 key to enter the selection.
- Use the right cursor to select the Exit menu.
- Select “Save Changes and Exit” then confirm the changes.
